

Anderson's turn at a milestone, throwing for a new passing record in the "Bragging Rights Trophy" Game

WOODBIDGE: Game Ten of the Woodbridge Barrons Football season has a lot incentives built into it. The game pits the Colonia Patriots against the Barrons for the annual Woodbridge Police PBA/SOA "Bragging Rights Trophy".

The award is presented by PBA President, Det. Dean Janowski to the winning team to be showcased in their respective schools for one year. The 2010 game will be the 44th meeting of the two Woodbridge School District High Schools. Colonia hold the edge in the series 22 – 17 – 4, but Woodbridge has held the award for the past two years.

In addition, the game gives the Woodbridge quarterback Kyle Anderson a crack at eclipsing Shawn McGrath's (1996-1997) school record of 29 career TD passes, 206 career pass completions and his single season record of 17 TD passes. Anderson, a junior currently it tied with 29 career TDs, and has 196 pass completions, and single season record of 17 TD passes.

Anderson's primary goal for the Saturday, November 20, 2010, 1pm game is to guide his team past a powerful Colonia team that was eliminated from the NJSIAA Playoffs in a wild 48 – 42 round one contest against Nutley this past week, while Woodbridge dominated a Hopewell Valley team in their NJSIAA consolation game 41 - 0. Nothing will come easy to either of these team when they face off in Colonia, and whatever the outcome, there is sure to be excitement.

Last week, Anthony Nyers created Woodbridge Football history when he became the career pass receptions leader with 74, passing Keith Hemmings (1996-1997) . Saturday, it may be Anderson's turn.
