



BARRONS –OPTIMISTIC

Despite the loss of several starters on offense and defense, the Barrons remain cautiously optimistic as the 2015 season gets underway next Friday night at home vs Carteret.

A young Woodbridge defense will need to grow up in a hurry. Eight starters were lost, but the new starters have the potential to meet high expectations. We saw it at times in the scrimmages. They will need to prove it against the Ramblers and beyond if the team is

to meet their lofty goals for the season. The goals include a GMC white division title and a deep run in a talent rich North Jersey , SECTION 2 , GROUP 1V, playoff bracket.

On defense, the Barrons are led by returning regulars Alex LaGrippio (41 Tackles, 2 sacks) and Bernardo Sanchez (28 Assisted Tackles) on the line and Robert Bognar. The defensive ends are Marquan Payne, Antonio Prestien-Lopez, and Scott Schroth. The linebackers include Nate Lanier (22 Assisted, 44 Solo, for 66 Tackles), Nick Nyers, Dylan Leone, and Christian Figueroa. Safeties are Quaasim Glover and James Modica. The corners are Keshawn “Scoobie” Henry and Darin Tabon.

On offense, Coach Bill Nyers has a number of veterans returning. The quarterback is strong armed Tracy Fudge (112 Completions on 191 Attempts for 1,545 yards, 10TD’s). The deep backfield includes Nate Lanier (563 Rushing yards, 103 Reception yards, 9TD’s); “Scoobie“ Henry (289 Rushing yards, 91 Reception yards, 5TD’s); and Ian Maina (577 Rushing yards , 4TD’s as a Sophomore two years ago.) The receiving group has Quaasim Glover (709 Receiving yards, 50 Receptions, 4 TD’s) and newcomer James Modica. Veterans on the line include center Dylan Leone and tackle David McDevitt. Additional starters should be Robert Bognar, Sydney Pierre, and Bernardo Sanchez.

The following players should be early season contributors: Hura Blaine (DB), Isaiah Esposito (QB/LB); Messiah Daniels (RB) Tyler Bork (WR/FS); Austin Taylor (RB); Kiere Cooper (RB) ; James Dunn (LB); Justice Isaac (LB); Dawud LeBron (DB); Stephan



Laly (OL/DL); and newcomers, Joseph Fail and Davian Martinez.



In the last night's preseason scrimmage vs East Brunswick, the Barrons got off to a slow start. After gaining an early first down, a Barron back fumbled at the 50. EB advanced the ball 17 yards on a run play. A questionable personal foul on a pass play moved the ball to the W 20. A simple hand off and EB had its first TD with 3:51 left in the first quarter. Following the kick off, Nate Lanier ran about 75 yards for a W score. He received good blocking from Tyler Bork and "Scoobie" Henry. At the end of the first quarter, the score was 6-7 in favor of EB



Early in the second quarter, the W quarterback was tackled in the end zone following an attempted pass play. EB took a 6-9 lead. W kicked off and EB made five consecutive first downs on a combination of passes and runs. With 4:20 remaining in the second quarter, EB scored its second TD to take a 6-15 lead. With 3:35 left, Nate Lanier ran around the left side, broke some tackles and ran off another 75 yard TD. Ian Maina took the pitch for a two point conversion. The scoreboard read 14-15. EB ran off two more first downs. However, with .43 seconds left in the half, "Scoobie" Henry read the pass play very well, turned for the ball, and made a shoe string catch in stride to score a huge 80 yard interception return and give W its first lead at 20-15.



The Barrons only had the ball for eleven first half plays but they made the most of it with Lanier's two long TD runs and Henry's Int. EB had ten first downs in the half to only one for W. EB missed a 37 yard field goal try right before the end of the half. The second half was fairly even. With 5:44 left in the third quarter, W blocked a punt but EB recovered and ran for a first down. In the fourth quarter, Austin Taylor gave W its



final TD. The extra point try was good to give the Barrons a 27-15 scrimmage victory.



In the post-game locker room, Coach Nyers said, “we showed our youth at several positions “. He, also, reaffirmed an earlier statement that he wants his team “to get more physical”. Despite the sluggish start, the Barrons did get the big plays to defeat a solid GMC Red Division team. This should be a confidence booster for a relatively young W team. The new starters need to continue to work hard in practice, listen to their coaches, stay united, and give 100%. If they can do these things, positive results will happen. The team must avoid big penalties and avoid critical turnovers. The players need to play smart and play with physicality. The Barrons can match or exceed last year’s record (7-4) if they avoid serious injuries, and learn and mature as the season progresses. GO BARRONS !!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

Best on offense: Bryce Barneys was one of several playmakers for Colonia last season, and he’ll again have the chance to make an impact during his senior season. The swing back ran for 166 on just 22 carries, while also catching 25 passes for 324 yards and four touchdowns. Along with his brother and fellow senior Chase Barneys, Bryce should again have a big impact offensively and defensively, where they have started for three seasons.

Best on defense: Sam Kamara will be a force along the defensive line for Carteret, using his size and speed to slow down opposing running and passing games. The 6-3, 250-pound defensive end can get off the edge quickly to apply pressure in the backfield. With Carteret expected to run out a young secondary, the team will rely on Kamara to set the tone up front.

Colonia will win the division because: Colonia has plenty of experience and talent returning at the skills positions, with the Barneys brothers, plus wide receiver Tyler Santos. Senior Bashir Lauderdale is expected to carry



the load at running back with his physical style. Colonia also has plenty of talent on the defensive side with Rutgers commit Solomon Manning anchoring the linebackers, plus veteran defensive backs. The biggest question mark surrounding the Patriots entering the season is the inexperience along the offensive and defensive lines after graduating everyone from last season's team. But if Colonia can have its new faces quickly and effectively fill those holes, the team will be in great shape for another strong season.

Don't sleep on Woodbridge: The Barrons have some key pieces back from their 2014 squad that finished 7-4. Senior quarterback Tracy Fudge will be back under center after throwing for 1,545 yards and 10 touchdowns last season. Nathan Lanier racked up 563 rushing yards and seven touchdowns, while Quassim Glover led the team in receiving with 709 yards as a sophomore. With them and other experience players back, Woodbridge could make some more noise as it aims for a higher finish in the standings.
