1. Piscataway (1-0): Elijah Barnwell rushed for 129 yards and three touchdowns, while Danny Haus completed all six of his passes for 142 yards and two scores as the Chiefs defeated East Brunswick for the 25th consecutive time, 42-7.

2. South Brunswick (0-1): The Vikings, who uncharacteristically passed for 252 yards as their triple option was limited to 26 more on the ground, squandered a 21-3 lead in a 41-21 loss to state power Middletown South.

3. Old Bridge (1-0): Sophomore quarterback Artur Sitkowski, who holds offers from Rutgers and Maryland,



had an auspicious debut as a starter, completing 13 of 17 passes for 159 yards and two scores in a 27-6 win over North Brunswick.

Glover, Marquan power Woodbridge

 WOODBRIDGE If Quaasim Glover and Marquan Payne had superhero powers, perhaps their best attributes would be going invisible. Each Woodbridge High School football player made an early big play, untouched,

against Bishop Ahr in Friday's GMC White Division contest.

The Barrons jumped to a three-touchdown lead and cruised to a 38-7 win at Nicholas A. Priscoe Stadium. Woodbridge, ranked No. 4 in the Home News Tribune Top 10, used passing early and then power running late to seal the victory.

Woodbridge senior quarterback Tracy Fudge threw three touchdowns and connected on three two-point conversion passes. Glover caught two touchdowns and had 120 receiving yards, while running backs Nate Lanier and Keshawn Henry each rushed for a touchdown. Defensively, Alex Lagrippa recovered two fumbles and Christopher Powers recovered a blocked punt.

"The defense did an outstanding job," Woodbridge coach Bill Nyers said. "The line opened up holes. It was a real good effort and I was real happy for the kids."

Everything came together in the first quarter as Woodbridge led 22-0 after the first eight minutes. Two of the touchdowns were set up by defensive plays. On the opening possession, Woodbridge faced a second-and-11 from its own 49-yard line. Enter Glover's Marvel moment. The 6-foot-1, 180-pound junior found himself wide open around Bishop Ahr's 20-yard line. He caught the pass from Fudge with no defender around him, stumbled a tad, but recovered for a 51-yard touchdown. Glover caught the two-point conversion for an 8-0 lead with 10:19 left in the first quarter.

"The corner sat in coverage and I was able to get over the top of him," Glover said. "But he played great defense the whole game. ... We've got great receivers on this team. Again, it's not cockiness. We just work really hard every day in practice."

Enter Payne and his Captain America moment. On the next possession, Bishop Ahr faced a third-and-six from its 40-yard line. The 5-foot-7, 170-pound defensive end raced to Trojans quarterback Tom Galante from the blind side, and smacked him in his back loosening the football. Lagrippa recovered the ball on the 28-yard line.



On the first play, Lanier took the handoff and went left. He didn't see any openings and broke back to the right side, finding space down the sideline for a 28-yard score. Glover again hauled in the two-point throw from Fudge for a 16-0 advantage with 6:35 remaining in the first quarter.

The Barrons (2-0) got another defensive play when Powers recovered a blocked punt on the 15-yard line. Two plays later, Tyler Bork caught a 15-yard touchdown pass up the middle for a 22-0 lead with 3:57 remaining in the first quarter.

The Trojans (0-2) scored their lone touchdown when Andrew Brazicki rushed in from four yards out with 2:52 left in the first quarter. The junior set up the score with a 24-yard run up the middle.

"We have a good chemistry on the line," Payne said. "Actually, all defensive-wide we all have a good chemistry. Once opponents score, we don't get down and we keep on playing."

As far as possessing super powers, both Payne and Glover were asked if they could possess any superpower, what would it be - and invisible wasn't the answer.

Payne answered: "To fly."

While Glover added, "Superman, yeah, he's the guy. I want to be him. I want to fly, move fast, that's about it."

At times Friday, both seemed to fit that bill.

Quassim Glover caught six passes for 120 yards and two touchdowns to lead Woodbridge to a 38-7 win over Bishop Ahr in Woodbridge.

Glover caught touchdown passes of 51 and 11 yards respectively from quarterback Tracy Fudge. Fudge completed 11-of-17 passes for 182 yards and three touchdowns. Fudge also completed three 2-point conversion passes, two of which went to Glover and one to James Modica. Keshawn Henry carried 18 times for 98 yards, which included a 1-yard touchdown plunge in the third quarter. Nathan Lanier ran seven times for 88 yards and a 28-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Defensively, Alex Lagrippio recovered two fumbles and Marquan Payne forced a fumble.

Tommy Galante scored the lone touchdown for Bishop Ahr, on a 4-yard run in the first quarter.
